Well done to this Year 6 child who won the raffle prize this week. 379 pupils got 100% attendance this week!





Rule of Law

In the news this week

The Royal Family's right to privacy has made news headlines worldwide over the past few weeks. Catherine, the Princess of Wales, recently released a video explaining her health issues and continued treatment, following an operation and diagnosis. King Charles III also announced he is receiving treatment for a different illness, making them a large focus of media attention. Interest in the personal lives of the Royal Family and other celebrities is very high, with many news outlets choosing to write stories about them. Following both announcements, the Royal Family has released statements requesting privacy.
