Wednesday - Year 6

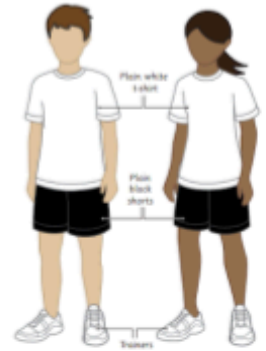
Thursday - Year 2
