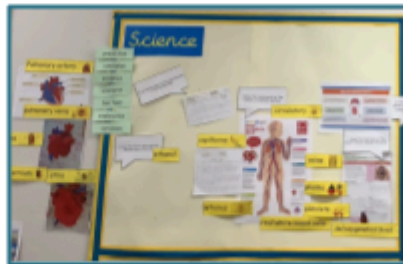
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Science at Chiltern

Every week, children are chosen to receive certificates that fit in with our Learning Muscles. This week some of the children are using their keep improving muscles:



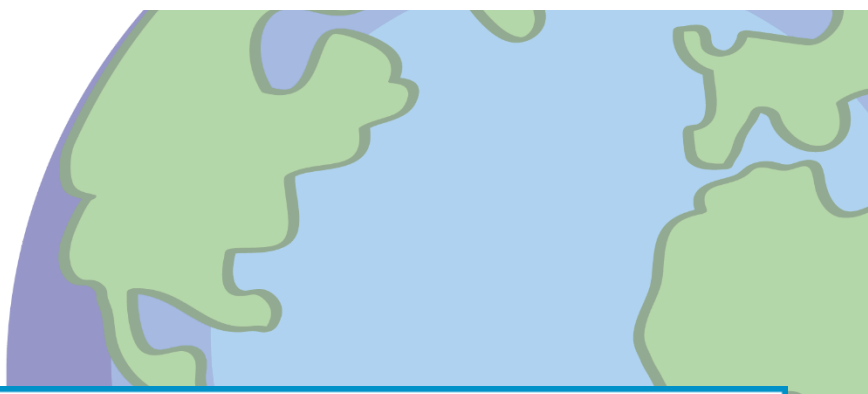
1MP working hard to keep improving their letter formation and handwriting.

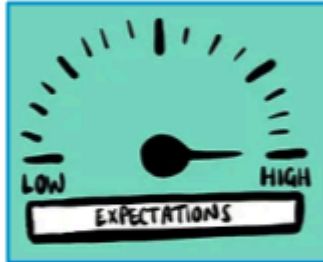


High Expectation Celebrations

It is important to remember our actions have consequences, which can affect the environment.

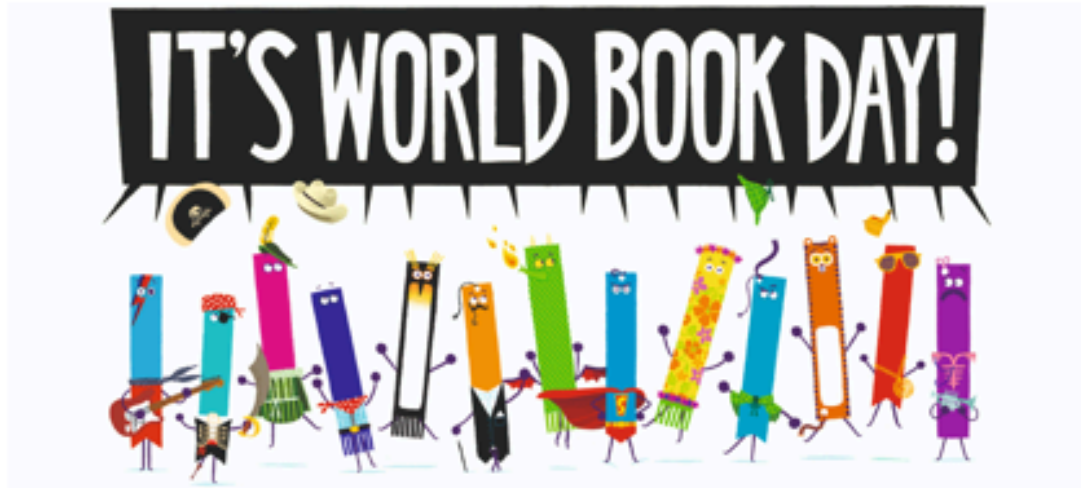


In the news this week
