Mrs Marshall's Messages:

I hope you are well. This morning's assembly focused on the Oxford children's word of the year: kindness. The children talked about being kind and the impact of unkind behaviour, which can unfortunately lead to bullying when it is several times on purpose ...

We emphasised the phrase "Stop!" (Start Telling Other People) to encourage children to speak up if they experience or witness bullying. It's crucial they know who to approach for help.

Your support at home is vital in promoting kindness. We encourage you to discuss the difference between being unkind occasionally and bullying, which is Several Times On Purpose: STOP! with your children and explore acts of kindness together.

NSPCC Number Day 2025


Friday 7th February
