Every week, children are chosen to receive certificates that fit in with our Learning Muscles. This week some of the children are having a go:



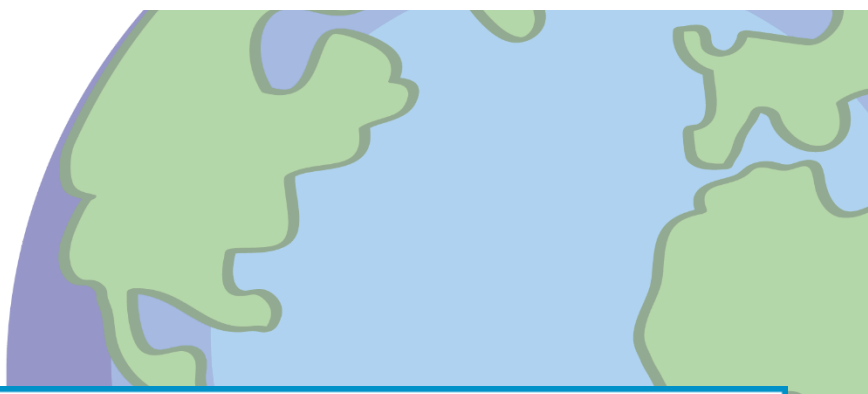
**1MP** having a go at writing about their favourite toy this week in history.

**5JG** had a go at making batter mixture for pancakes and yorkshire puddings. Yum!

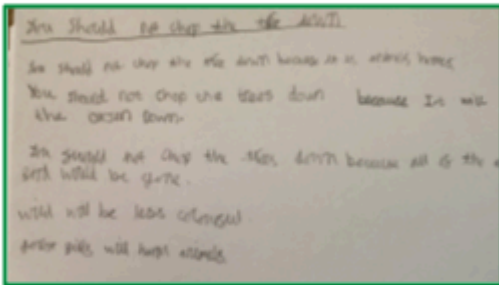

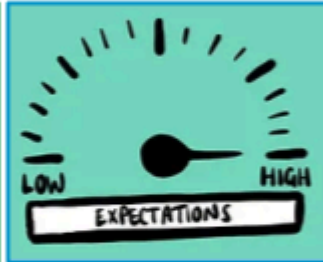


## High Expectation Celebrations
