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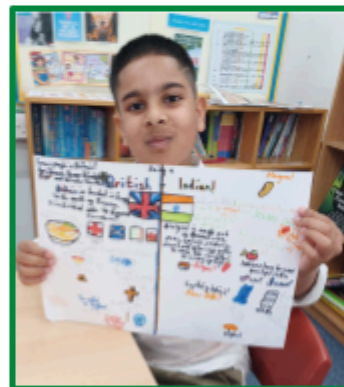
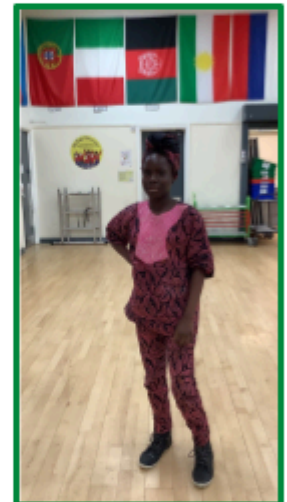
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Celebrating World Day for Cultural Diversity

6BH had a go at creating presentations to explain to their peers about cultural differences.

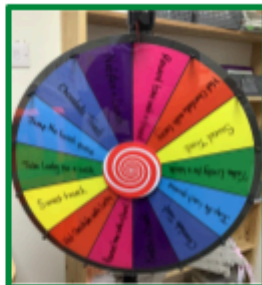
F2 had a go at learning about fire people this week. Even having a go at using the fire hose!
